Guiding Principles for the creation and use of Pewabic Pottery tiles in the design of the University of Michigan C.S. Mott Children's and Women's Hospitals.

Pewabic Pottery is a Michigan organization devoted to maintaining the tradition of hand crafted pottery as a continuation of the Arts and Crafts movement of the late 19th Century. Pewabic Pottery is the Midwest's only historic pottery, and it has been in existence since 1903.

1. The "Mott patient tiles" will be made at U-M C.S. Mott Children's Hospital. These tiles will be made by current and former patients under the age of 18.
2. The total number of tiles used in the design is limited.
3. The tiles are available for purchase through the Mott Development office on a first come, first serve basis. Requests for tile placements cannot be accommodated.
4. The tile designs will be directed by the interior design team for the new facility. No tiles will have a person's name on the front.
5. The family of the child that creates the "Mott patient tile" will receive a photo of their child's tile to keep. A booklet will be created for these families and will contain a photo of each individual "Mott patient tile" with the location noted so the tiles can be found in the new facility.
6. Purchasers of "Mott patient tile" who have designated their tile to be created by a specific Mott current or former patient but are not family members will have the opportunity to have a duplicate photo of the tile. They will be able to purchase the tile booklet if they choose.
7. Once a tile is created, it becomes the property of the U-M C.S. Mott Children's Hospital and Women's Hospital. It will be used solely for the interior design of the new facility. Duplicate tiles will not be made available.
8. Only the "Mott patient tile" will be in the tile locator booklet.
9. An employee and volunteer donor tile wall will be located in the lobby garden. Employees/ volunteers/ their family members can create these tiles.
10. Employees and volunteers or their families who decorate tiles may bring a camera to take a picture of their tile while they are decorating it. A picture will not be provided nor will their tile be located for them upon completion of the employee and volunteer donor wall.
